PROJECT GOALS

The main goal of the project is to transform the Southern Baltic area into a year-round horse tourism destination.

This will be achieved, among other things, by supporting tourism service providers in creating and promoting offers that make horse tourism accessible to a wide range of tourists and residents.

BUILDING NETWORKS – Establishing regional partnerships for the development of horse tourism focused on social integration and collaboration for the exchange of experiences and joint actions.

IMPROVING INFRASTRUCTURE – Piloting and implementing next-generation horse trails to provide more multifaceted horse experiences (i.e., "scenic trails" leading through picturesque landscapes, trails with stops at interesting places).

PRODUCT INNOVATIONS – Introducing innovative horse tourism offers targeting new groups (e.g., horseback trips for companies), extending the season (e.g., "horses and gastronomy" packages), or tailored to residents' needs.

REPOSITIONING – Launching a joint marketing campaign to change the "exclusive" image of horseback riding both among visitors and residents while promoting the Southern Baltic Sea Region (BSR) as an inclusive "horse tourism destination for everyone".
